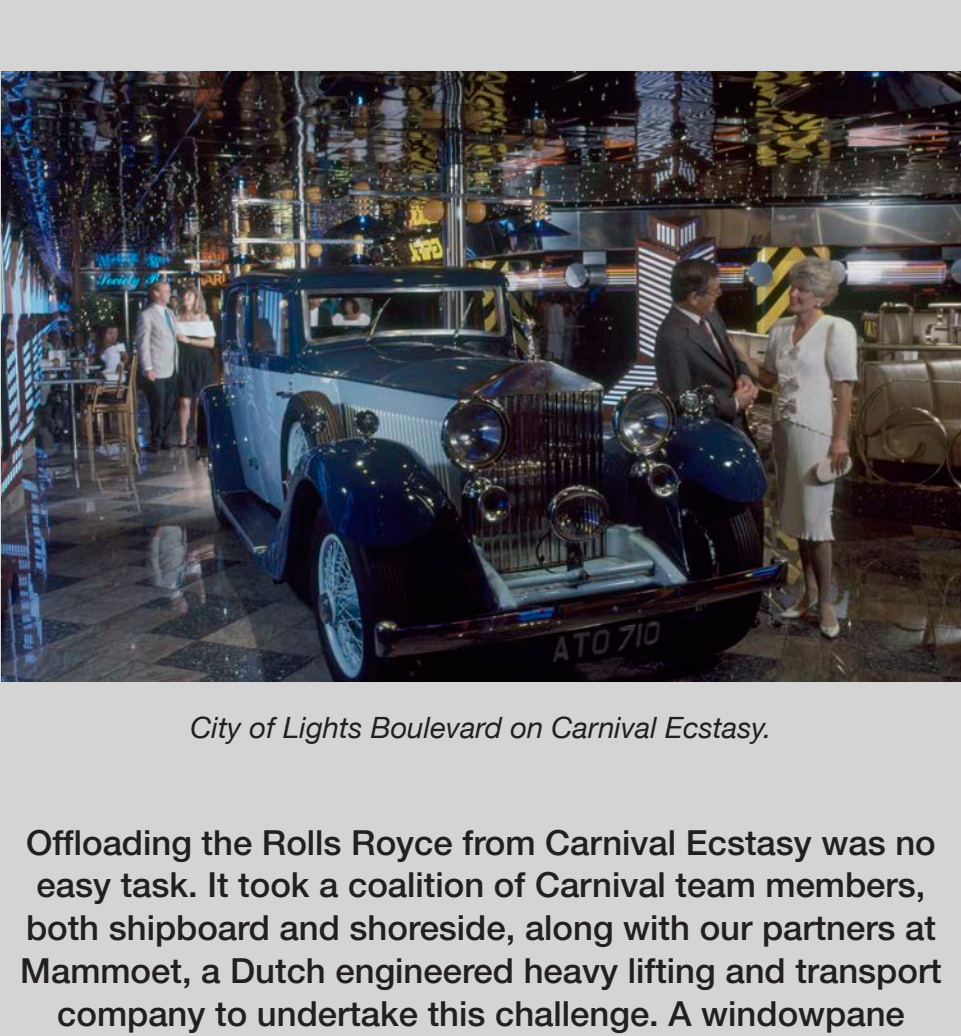


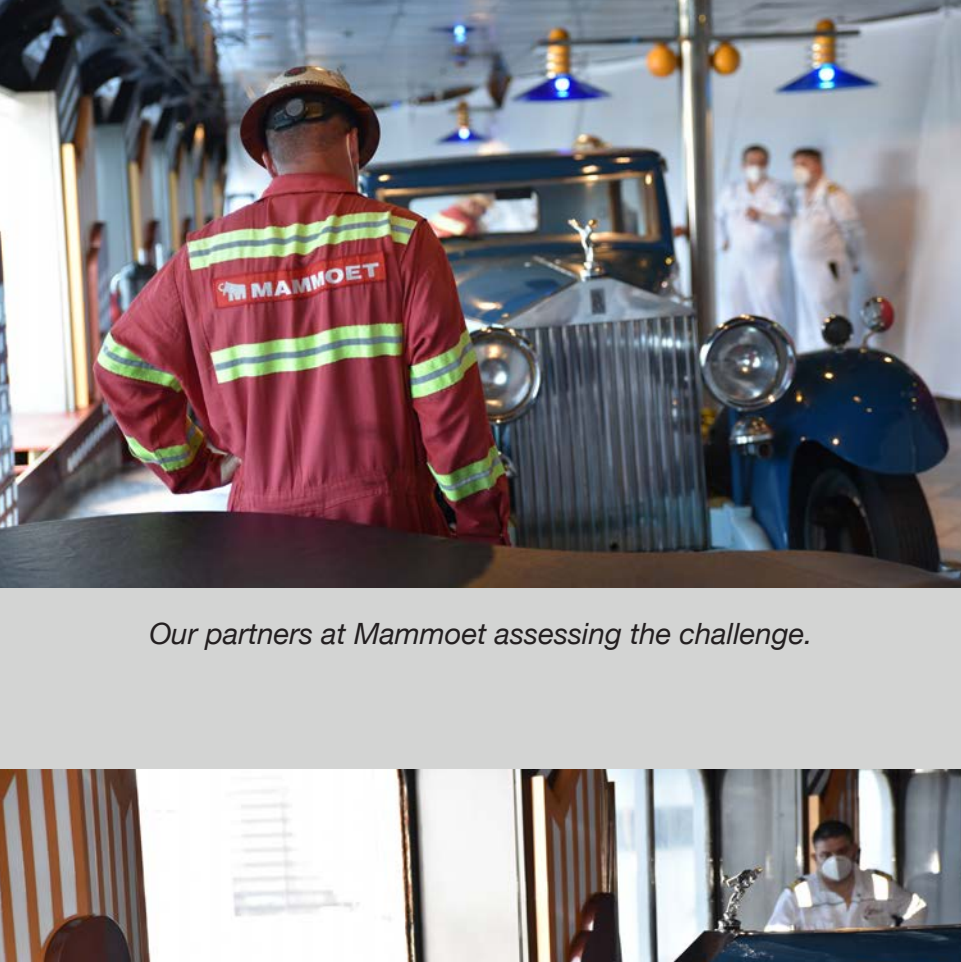
Carnival Celebration™

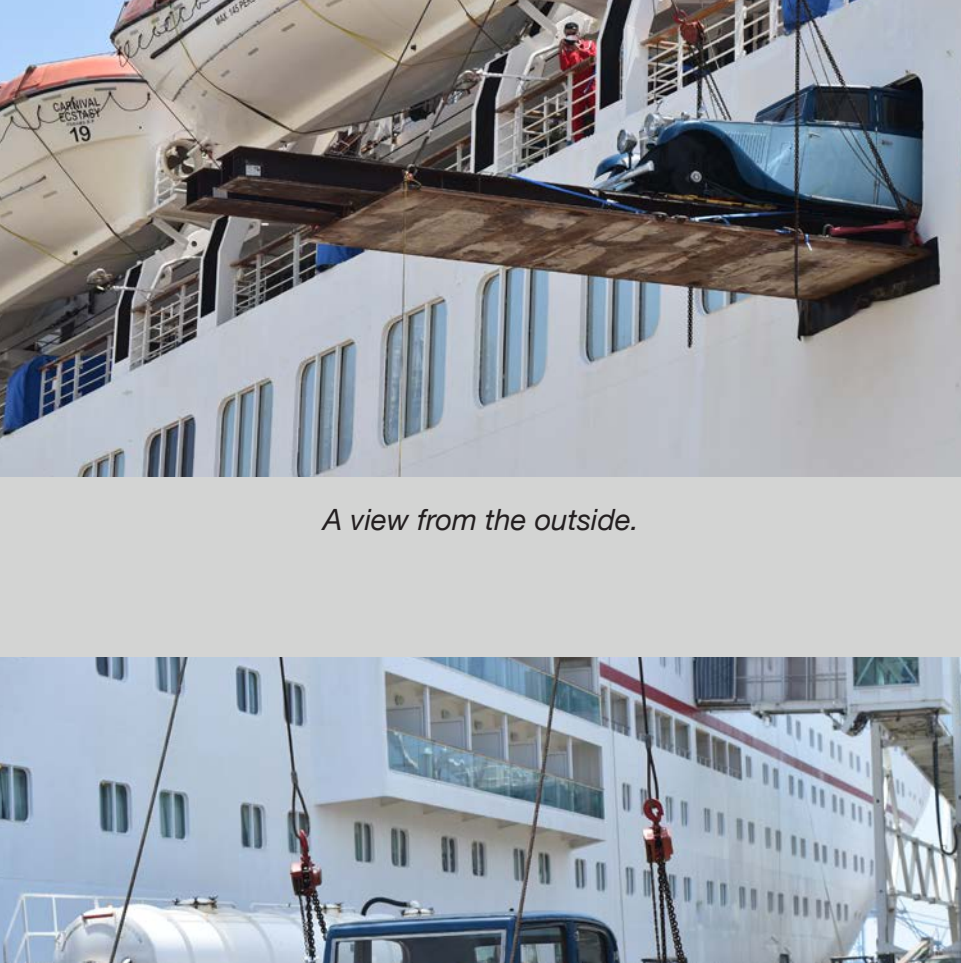


The Rolls Royce after it was acquired in Northern Wales.

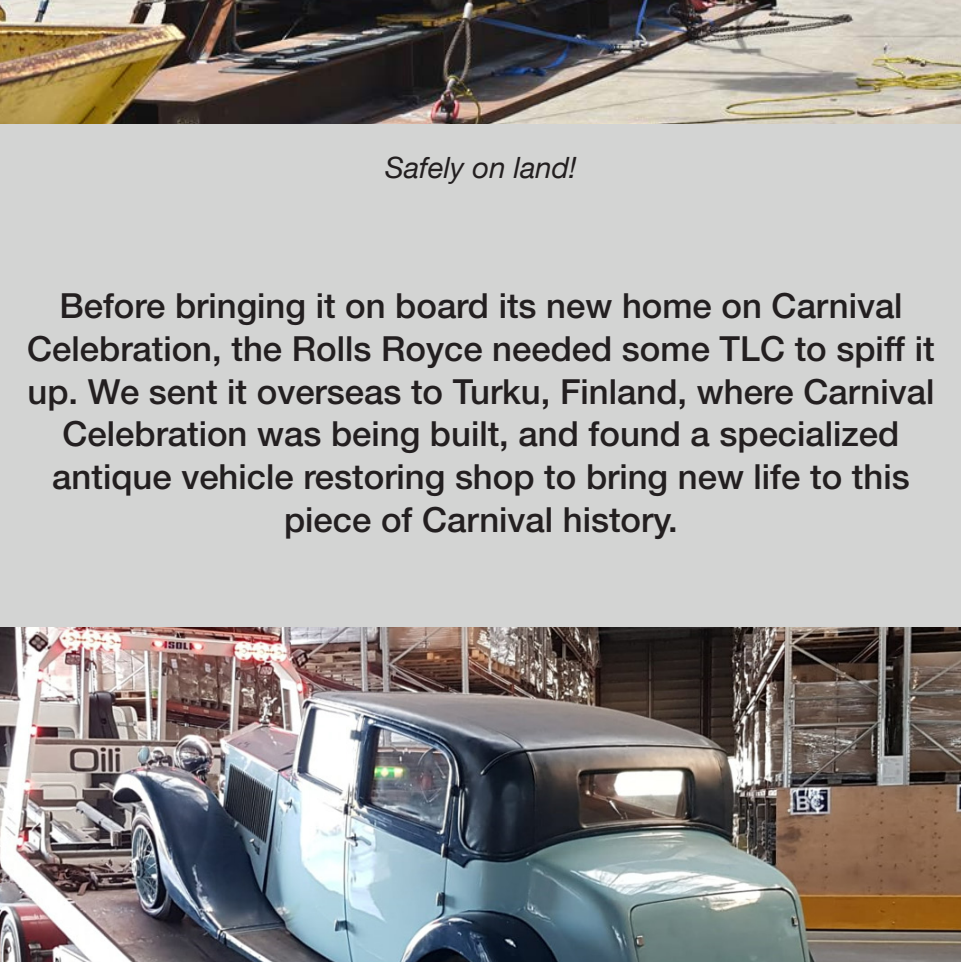


City of Lights Boulevard on Carnival Ecstasy.

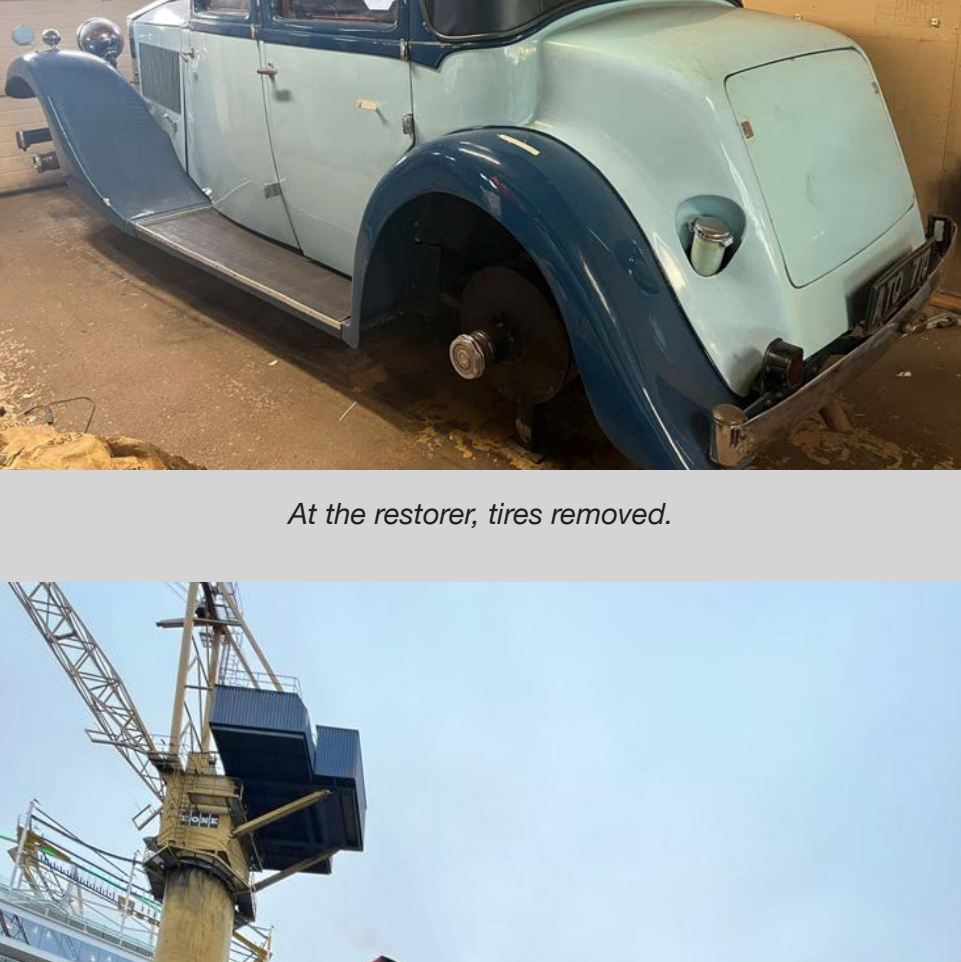

A view from the outside.

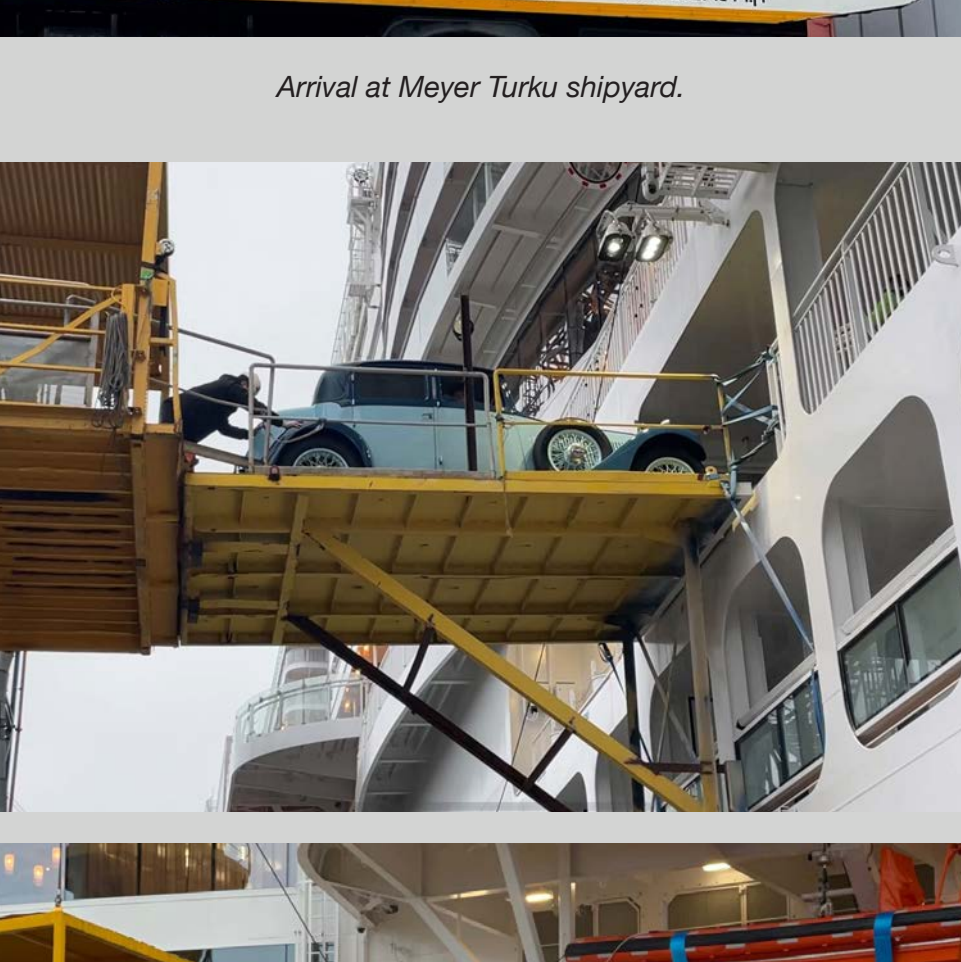


Safely on land!

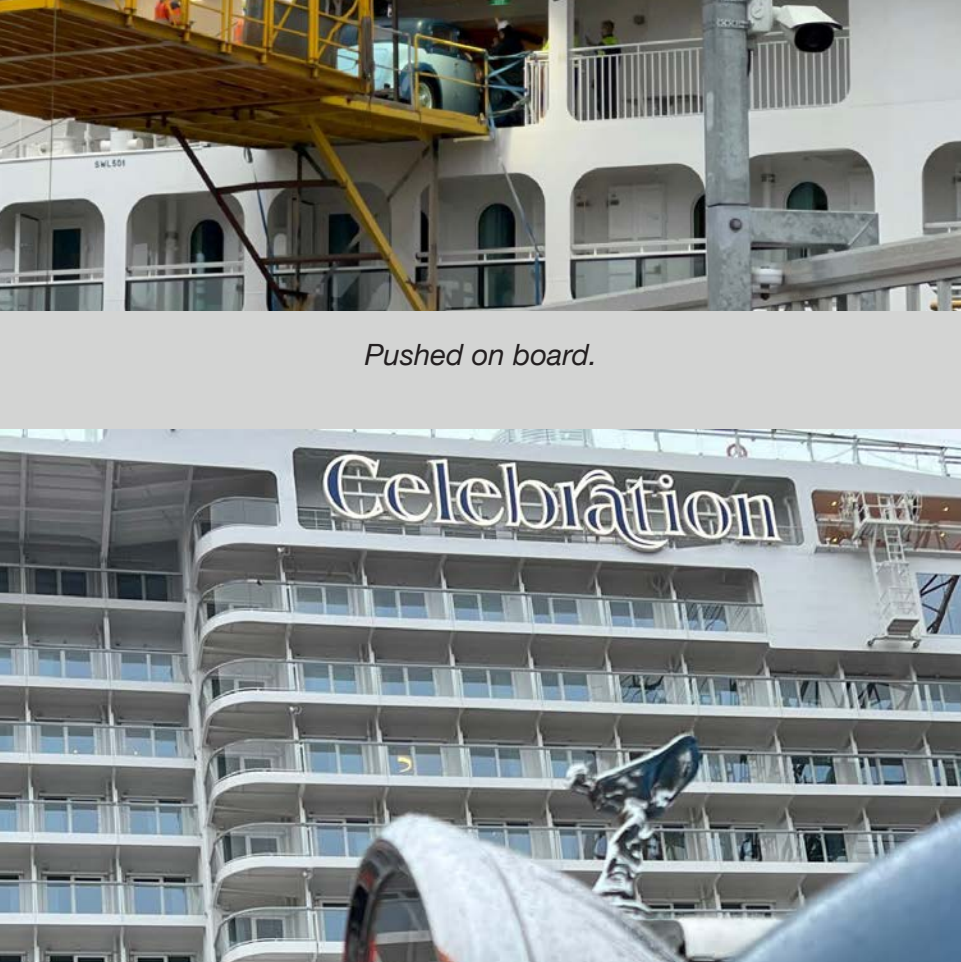

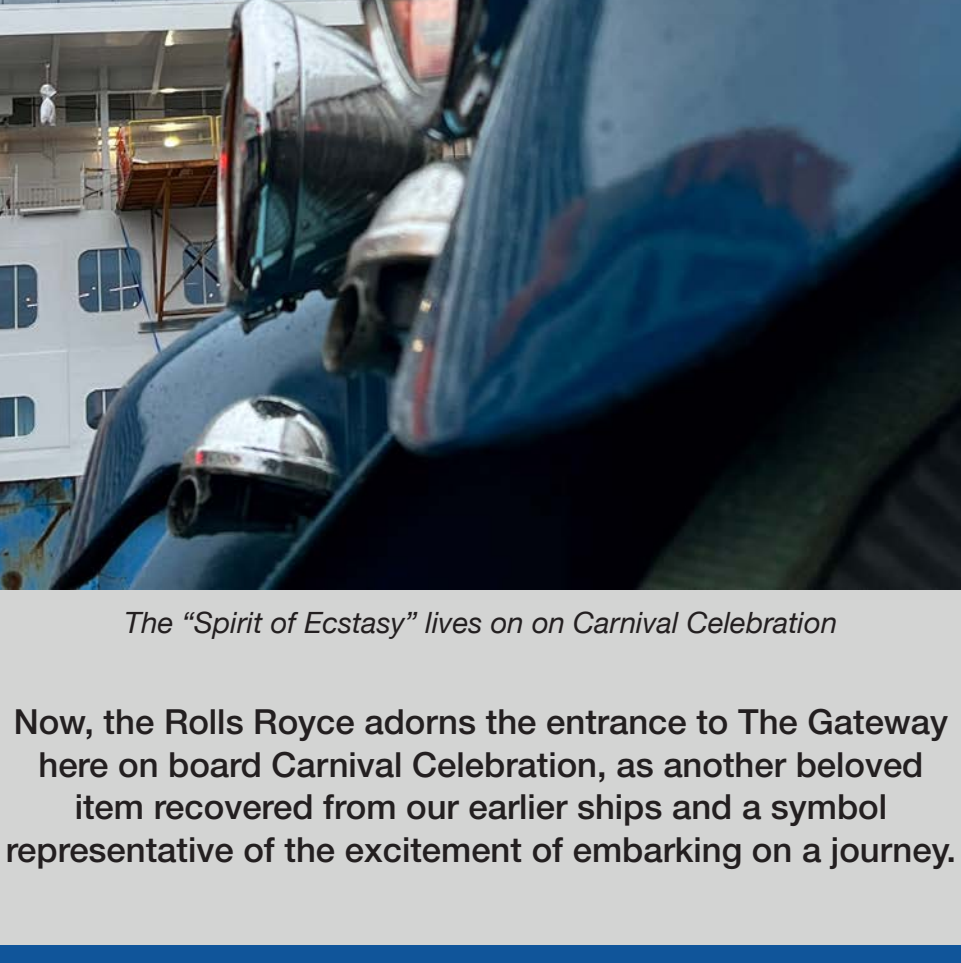
